## 4-Year Old Learning Goals

### Math

- Identify and write numerals 1-20
- Count objects to 20
- Demonstrate one-to-one correspondence of objects
- Sort items by various attributes: color, shape, size
- Differentiate sizes: small, medium, large
- Identify shapes: square, rectangle, circle, triangle, oval
- Match: symbols, shapes, patterns
- Learn calendar system: days of the week and months

### Literacy

- Alphabet: learn letter names and sounds
- Phonics: learn blending sounds and read simple words
- Recognize, spell, and write first name
- Hold a pencil, crayon, and marker correctly
- Answer questions about stories and re-tell familiar stories
- Repeat simple nursery rhymes and songs
- Build new vocabulary
- Build listening skills
- Learn to sequence
- Develop fine motor skills using play-doh, scissors, and manipulatives
- Identify rhyming words

### Social Skills

- Practice problem-solving skills in social situations
- Develop social skills by working in groups to complete projects
- Learn to share classroom materials, toys, books, etc.
- Practice using manners: please, thank you, excuse me, table manners
- Learn to positively communicate his/her needs

### Christianity

- Learn and sing a blessing before snack time daily
- Listen to Old and New Testament Bible stories, including stories about the life of Jesus
- Recognize that plants, animals, and humans are God's creation
- Recognize that God created families to love and take care of one another
- Learn Jesus' teachings to love God and love others
- Attend chapel weekly

There is no homework; however, "fun work" is sent home weekly. Completion is optional but allows the student to submit completed work in exchange for a small reward (e.g. stickers). In summary, each day is busy learning about God's world, developing social skills and getting along with one another. To develop manual skills, your student will be writing, coloring, and using glue sticks. Your student will hear stories, poetry, and music, which develop comprehension, language, and thinking abilities. **LCS uses the A Beka curriculum. We believe the use of the A Beka curriculum sets LCS apart from other schools.**
