

2-Year Old Learning Goals

Math

- Introduction to counting (numbers 1-10)
- Introduction to the calendar
- Introduction to colors and shapes

Literacy

- Recognize child's name in print
- Build listening skills
- Learn and recite the days of the week
- Develop fine motor skills using play-doh, scissors, painting, coloring and manipulatives
- Learn and recite the Pledge of Allegiance

Social Skills

- Practice cooperation and compassion with classmates
- Practice taking turns and be a good friend
- Learn the difference between 'real' and 'pretend'
- Practice pretending
- Learn table manners and practice sitting at the table for lunch

Christianity

- Learn to sing a blessing and practice it every day before snack time
- Listen to Old and New Testament Bible stories, including stories about the life of Jesus
- Recognize that plants, animals, and humans are God's creations
- Learn about God's love
- Attend chapel weekly

Each day in the life of the Legacy 2-year olds is busy learning about God's world, developing social skills and getting along with one another. To develop manual skills, your child will practice working with pencils, crayons, and washable markers, coloring, and using glue sticks. Your child will hear stories, poetry, and music, which develops comprehension, language, and thinking abilities.
